

## **The Presidential Parade**

West Branch, Iowa - On Monday, February 15 at the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library-Museum, archivist Craig Wright will present “The Presidential Parade”, a fun look at our presidents and the Presidential Library system. The presentation begins at 2 p.m. and is free with paid admission to the museum.

The Presidential Library system is composed of thirteen Presidential Libraries located throughout the United States. These facilities are overseen by the National Archives and Records Administration. Presidential Libraries are not libraries in the usual sense. They are archives and museums, bringing together in one place the documents and artifacts of a President. Beginning with Hoover, and going forward, each president has a library-museum operated by the National Archives.

*The Presidential Parade* tells stories about many of the men who have served as president. The presentation also gives insight to other presidential libraries, including museums that are operated by private foundations and state governments.

Currently on display at the Hoover Museum is the exhibit, *Alaska and the Voyage of Understanding*. This exhibit follows the travels of President Harding and Secretary of Commerce Herbert Hoover as they travel through Alaska in 1923.
